

Over the Hills to Glory Talk The Story of the Ascott Martyrs

Why, in May 1873, did exchanges at the gate into a bean field between two young farm labourers and a group of women from the village of Ascott-under-Wychwood, lead to the imprisonment in Oxford Gaol of 16 women, and two babies? The magistrates' decision provoked a riot in Chipping Norton, featured widely in the national press and resulted in questions being asked in Parliament. This talk explores the story of the Martyrs and what it reveals about the lives of the agricultural labourer and his family.

This talk, by Carol Anderson, will be held in the Clifton Centre on Monday 17th July at 7:30pm.

contribution of the Priory; to look for clues to people's living conditions in the past and, of course, to appreciate some architectural gems.

The girls' enthusiasm and ability to speculate about features we spotted on the walk was inspiring.

The Brownies left with a copy of the Town Trail and it's to be hoped that they will have been motivated to continue their exploration of the town's history.
